NOMINATIONS:

- Nominations will be open from February 17 to February 27, 2009.
- Self-nomination is the only accepted procedure. A nomination petition is attached.
- A nominating petition must be completed and delivered to the Elections Committee Office in the Rosenthal Library 3rd floor Information Booth.
- Late petitions will not be accepted under any circumstances.
- All full-time faculty, tenured or non-tenured, are eligible to run. Faculty holding the following ranks may run: Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor, Instructor, and Lecturer. Faculty status for the purpose of election is defined as of Feb. 20, 2009.
- Nominating petitions declared invalid because of errors may be resubmitted in corrected form by Feb.27, 2009. They will not be accepted thereafter.

- The Elections Committee will post verification (or non-verification) of your stated status at the Elections Committee office in the Rosenthal Library 3rd floor Information Booth as soon as possible.
- You are responsible for notifying the Elections Committee of any errors in your status, etc. that appear in any of its notices, on bulletin boards, in the newspapers, or elsewhere.
- The deadline for notification or errors to the Elections Committee is Feb. 27, 2009. Information not changed by that date will be presumed to be correct and used for the ensuing ballot.
